Refer a patient to Rejoin

Verify, generate a code, and get a patient set up with a free trial.

As a verified clinician you get Rejoin+ to evaluate, and you can invite patients with a code that starts a free trial when they connect. This all happens on the clinician portal at portal.rejoinvoice.com.

For clinicians using the Rejoin clinician portal.

1. Verify your account

Sign up on the portal with your name, discipline, and NPI. Most NPIs verify automatically within seconds; the rest go to a short manual review. Once verified, your professional Rejoin+ access turns on so you can try every feature your patients will use.

2. Generate a patient code

From your dashboard, open Patient invites and tap Generate a patient code. Each code is short, easy to read aloud, and expires in 14 days. You can hold up to 30 active codes at once.

3. Send it to your patient

Enter the patient's email and Rejoin emails them the code plus a download link, or Copy invite message to send it yourself however you like. The patient's email is used only to send and is never stored.

4. What the patient does

The patient downloads Rejoin, creates a free account, then opens the Me tab, taps Connect with your clinician, and enters the code. They see, in plain language, exactly what they will and will not share, choose what to share, and connect. A 30-day Rejoin+ trial starts for them.

5. See them in your dashboard

Once a patient connects, they appear in your caseload with the summaries they consented to: how much they are using Rejoin, and gentle check-in trends. It is content-free by design, you never see their messages, sayings, or care notes, only counts, dates, and the check-in scales they chose to share.
