Read your caseload dashboard

See how connected patients are doing, between visits.

Once a patient connects with you, they appear in your dashboard with the summaries they chose to share. It is a between-visit signal, not a chart, and it is content-free by design.

For clinicians using the Rejoin clinician portal.

1. Your caseload

The dashboard lists every patient connected with you, with their plan (trial, subscribed, or free) and when they were last active. You can give each one a private label so the list reads the way you think.

2. Usage at a glance

Open a patient to see how much they are using Rejoin this week, how many days they were active, and how that compares to the week before. A drop can be a useful prompt to check in.

3. Check-in trends

If the patient chose to share check-ins, you see gentle trends over time for mood, pain, breathing, energy, and swallowing, on the app's one-to-five scale. Trends only, never a single number out of context.

4. What you can and cannot see

Everything here is counts, dates, and the check-in scales the patient shared. You never see what they actually said, their sayings, or their care notes. If a patient revokes sharing, they simply drop off your dashboard.

Only the scales the patient chose to share.

You can see

- Messages spoken (a count)
- Active days
- Custom phrases (a count)
- Shared check-in trends

You never see

- What they actually said
- Their sayings and phrases
- Their care notes
- Their About-me profile
